Cooper Cochran named Director at Louisiana

James Cooper Cochran was appointed the director of the Louisiana Small Business Development Center at LSU in Shreveport in April 2007. He joined the LSUS SBDC in 2005 with 30 years of experience in financial, manufacturing and management operations.

"I look forward to working with existing small business owners and potential small business owners throughout our eight parish area," Cochran said. "Our goal is to facilitate the formation and growth of small businesses."

Cochran was born and raised in Rayville in Northeast Louisiana. He graduated from the University of Louisiana at Monroe and received his commission in the U.S. Army. After completing two years active military service, he remained in the Army Reserves for more than 28 years, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel.

Cochran's business background includes experience managing multiple retail operations, serving as comptroller, industrial engineer and as plant manager of a local manufacturing firm.

Cochran also brings an extensive background in numerous civic organizations, including the Jaycees, Kiwanis and the ULM Alumni Association. He has served on several advisory boards, including the Richland Parish Extension Service and the Louisiana Gold Swim Team. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College where he served as an instructor for five years.

He was married for 32 years to the late Sheila Cochran, and they have two sons, Jimmy and John Cochran and one grandson, Connor Cochran.



As director his duties will include serving as a business consultant, instructor for workshops and representing the center at economic development functions.

Madeline Henderson named Louisiana Minority Small Business Person of the Year

Madeline Henderson, owner of Henderson Construction Services, Inc. in Shreveport, has been named Minority Small Business Person of the Year by the Louisiana District office of the U.S. Small Business Administration.

Henderson has helped the company grow from two to 10 employees. Revenues grew by more than 75 percent from 2005 to 2006.

Henderson Construction Services is a general contractor providing services that include new construction, remodeling, painting, sidewalks, driveways, foundations and parking lots.

Henderson operates the business with her husband, Shelton.

Henderson is a client of the LSUS SBDC, which nominated her for the award. She is a graduate of Fasttrac entrepreneurship training and will graduate in October from the SBA's 8(a) business development program.

"Women are still having to prove themselves in this historically, male-dominated field," Henderson said. "However, through professional education, training and hard work, we are now being recognized as key players in the construction industry."

Entrepreneurship Training

The LSUS SBDC provides entrepreneurship training throughout the year. Here are some examples.

Business & Entrepreneurial Skills Training (BEST) is a 12week program offered each fall. Classes cover a smorgasbord of business topics, including developing a business plan. Forty-five students are en-

rolled in the Fall 2007 BEST. Sponsors are LSUS SBDC, City of Shreveport, Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, Bossier Chamber of Commerce and Southern University.



Louisiana Contractors Accreditation Institute (LCAI) is a collaboration between Louisiana Economic Development, Louisiana Community & Technical Colleges and Louisiana Small Business Development Center. Classes meet twice a week for six weeks and cover bonding, estimating, preparing for the general contractor's exam and other topics. Twenty business owners and prospective business owners attended classes in July-August. The next session runs Oct. 30-Dec. 13.

Developing Your Child Care Business is a nine-week program for



individuals wanting to open their own child care center. The LSUS SBDC offered this Fasttrac entrepreneurship training twice in the summer of 2007 — in conjunction with the Louisiana Pathways at Northwestern State University and with the LSU AgCenter in Claiborne Parish.
