Our statewide network of nine centers partners with Louisiana Economic Development and the U.S. Small Business Administration to provide business consulting at no cost to small business owners and entrepreneurs to help them start and grow their businesses. LSBDC also provides low-cost business training and business information and tools at no cost.

According to the latest independent study, *ASBDC Economic Impact Study*, LSBDC has improved its performance in helping small businesses increase sales and create jobs.

Moving up four percentage points, LSBDC clients are seeing a 29% greater sales increase as compared to the average Louisiana business.

Jumping by five percentage points, LSBDC clients are experiencing a 16% greater increase in employment levels as compared to the average Louisiana business.
